

HR 218 Firearms Qualifications 2020

The Broward Sheriff's Office Institute for Criminal Justice Studies is offering BSO retired DLE and DOD deputies, as well as other retired certified law enforcement officers that reside in Broward County, an opportunity to qualify under HR 218/H.B. 143, Chapter 2007-111. Former Broward Sheriff's Office deputies are exempt from the requirement of having to reside within Broward County.

Qualifications for retired law enforcement deputies and officers will be held at the BSO Firearms Training Range (located at 16001 West State Road 84 Sunrise, Florida; at the Markham Park Shooting Range) on the following dates: **March 21, June 20, September 19, and November 21, 2020**. The range can accommodate up to 20 participants per relay. Relays will be scheduled starting at 8:00 am, with other times slots added as needed. Qualifications will be conducted by BSO's certified CJSTC Firearms Instructors.

Please see the following requirements in order to participate:

- By Florida law, all costs associated with the demonstration by such person to meet the required range testing component shall be the expense of the person being tested. The cost is \$75.00 per person for each qualification session attended.
- Only checks or money orders will be accepted. Payment should be made payable to the Broward Sheriff's Office. Participants may add "Firearms qualification, HR 218" to the note section of their check or money order.
- For those who do not have internet access, BSO Human Resources will be supplied with informational packets that can be picked up or mailed upon requests.
- Information will be posted in the BSO retiree website and on www.sheriff.org.
- Retired law enforcement deputies or officers who wish to participate must have:
 - o photo identification showing proof as a Broward County resident (for non-BSO retirees),
 - o photo identification issued by the agency from which the individual retired from service as a law enforcement officer,

form must be completed and notarized, prior to attending a qualification session,

- o BSO range rules and policies will be in effect and followed by each participant prior to qualification,
- o must meet the BSO current standards for qualifications, which require the employee to regularly qualify in the use of a firearm (please see the attached Range Rules and Policies and qualification course of fire),
- o use ammunition in the following calibers: 38 caliber, .380 caliber, 9 millimeter, 40 caliber and 45 calibers, issued by the BSO firearms (no other calibers of ammunition will be allowed),
- o only handguns chambered for the approved calibers will be authorized,
- o firearms will be inspected for safety and functionality by BSO firearms instructors,
- o firearms found to be unsafe or un-serviceable will not be allowed on the firing line,
- o BSO firearms instructors conducting the qualification will have the final discretionary authority to disqualify firearms or person(s) based on safety concerns.

Broward Sheriff's Office retired personnel currently residing out of the State of Florida and qualifying out of state, can contact the Broward Sheriff's Office, Employee Benefits section; in writing, requesting a verification of employment letter. Criminal Justice Standards and Training Commission Adopted the following Firearms Qualification Standard For Active Law Enforcement Officers

The Criminal Justice Standards and Training Commission at its August 2005 meeting in Coral Springs, following a review and discussion of the recommendations submitted by the Commission's Select Committee on Firearms Qualification Standards, adopted a statewide firearms qualification standard for active law enforcement officers.

The Commission's Firearms Qualification Standard shall be completed every other year beginning July 1, 2006, with the first reporting period ending June 30, 2008; the reporting period will be every two years thereafter. Any officer who fails to meet the required firearms qualification standard shall be removed from sworn duty until he or she has met the required standard. Any officer who fails to meet the standard by June 30, 2008, shall have his/her certification made inactive.

The Course of-Fire and the related requirements are outlined below:

ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS

- The B-21 E target or its equivalent is required
- The qualification course of fire shall be conducted in daylight conditions
- An officer must qualify with the type of weapon that is to be carried
- The qualification course of fire must be administered by a CJSTC certified firearms instructor
- The qualification course of fire may be conducted at either a CJSTC certified training school range, an agency range or a private range
- Remedial training and qualification may be conducted by employing agency.

FIREARMS RANGE RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 1. All weapons will be kept unloaded except when on firing line.
- 2. No loading or unloading of weapons will be permitted anywhere except in an area designated as such.
- 3. Weapons to be kept in holsters or gun box except when on firing line.
- 4. No loaded or unloaded weapon will be left unattended on the firing line, or in the classroom area. If a firearm is removed from the firing line, it will be unloaded with cylinder open, slide locked back or safely in a holster.
- 5. "Dry firing" will be allowed only at the direction, and under the supervision of a range instructor.
- 6. In case of a misfire or malfunction keep the muzzle of the weapons pointed in a safe direction (down range) at all times until corrective actions can be performed by the shooter or assisted by range instructor.
- 7. Eye and Hearing protection will be worn at all times while firing on the range.
- 8. Check weapon before loading for obstructions and load only on command of the range officer.
- 9. No talking will be permitted on or near firing line except by range officer or instructor.
- 10. No smoking will be allowed on the firing line or in the classroom area.
- 11. Do not step forward of firing line unless given command to do so by range instructors.
- 12. Never reach down to pick up loading devices or ammunition before the line is declared safe by the Range Master.
- 13. When leaving firing line, make sure weapon is unloaded, slide or cylinder open. "Weapon" will be inspected by instructor before leaving line.
- 14. Brass will be picked up when course of fire is over and at the instruction of the range officer.
- 15. Targets will be scored by range officers.
- 16. No superior weapons (any weapon other than common sidearm) will be fired on the pistol range without prior approval of the assigned range officer.
- 17. No one will be permitted to use the range for practice without the presence of a range officer. NO EXCEPTIONS!
- 18. Never point a firearm at anyone unless compatible with Deadly Force guidelines, F.S.S. 776.
- 19. Never anticipate a command while on the firing line
- 20. Orders of the range officer are to be obeyed without hesitation at all times.
- 21. No personnel will be allowed in range office or safe unless directed by an instructor.
